Introduction

Kinderenergy believes children are Earth's most important natural resource. *Kinderenergy* has Special Consultative Status with the United Nations Economic & Social Council and Observation Status with the UNFCCC. The best way to help kids reach their potential is to give them a strong academic background, entrepreneurship skills and the benefits of limited government and a free market economic system.

Undergraduate students from around the world selected to become a *Kinderenergy Fellow* meet in New York City for an in-depth analysis of how politics, diplomacy and international policies change with each new president and shape geo-politics. The Russian - Ukrainian - USA war in Europe, the Palestine - Israel War in the Middle East, the Taiwan-China problem in Asia and, the world's energy crisis, international development, the environment, food production, economic prosperity and the drive to net zero by 2050 are just a few of the topics we dive into during the Program. AI is here! How will that affect energy?

Under the leadership of Elisabeth Anne Delgado, CEO & Founder of *Kinderenergy*,



students will research, write papers and network with global experts about the historic, economic and social factors that are influencing peace and development today. In addition, *Fellows* will review *specific* policies affecting such transformative issues as global health, motherhood, personhood, education, youth employment and human flourishing.

Three week program for English speaking youth

This two to three-week program at the United Nations introduces top tier, inquisitive undergraduate students of economics, diplomacy, medicine, international law, engineering, architecture & journalism to the mission of *Kinderenergy*, while also examining the pressing events and policies negatively affecting the development of children today and the soft diplomacy being used within the UN to “eradicate global poverty and bring economic prosperity and peace to the world”. Students will take a critical view of the UN soft diplomacy to see whether these economic and energy policies are

actually improving the lives of the poor or are having the opposite effect on all of those trying to move out of poverty. Spain and Portugal just experienced a 10 hour blackout. What was the cause? Was the cause a mismanagement of renewable energy supply or a miscalculation of its fluctuation? We need to find out by speaking to the experts.

PROMOTING CHILDREN AND YOUTH AT THE UNITED NATIONS SINCE 2013.

In the past we have had briefings by experts from the energy industry, the UN Foundation, United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction, Global Foundation For Democracy & Development and UNICEF. In addition, while we are in NYC we hope to have interesting conversations with UN representatives from the EU, USA, the Arab world, Asia, Africa and Oceania.

FOCUS AREAS:

SDGs: Eradicate poverty, educate the children, stimulate entrepreneurship, create youth employment, provide clean drinking water and energy at schools and to all people are at the heart of a historic agreement signed in 2015 by member states of the United Nations. That agreement, called "*Transforming Our World: The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development*," is a universal call to end poverty, secure justice, and protect the planet for future generations by the year 2030. What are the environmental, social and financial costs of this Agenda and, are the policies really helping those who need it most?

We will find answers to big questions: *Social Justice* is a term much used these days but what does it actually mean for everyone? How will this social agenda be financed? By whom and how much will it cost annually? Why is nuclear energy not a hot topic when it is a powerful, cheap, clean, reliable source of low carbon energy with the potential of satisfying the energy needs of a growing world? There has been a push to mandate use of electric vehicles in the EU and the USA but why are many national policies (France & Spain) backing away from this trend now? If we are interested in feeding the hungry why are we getting rid of farms in the EU and the USA and covering them with solar panels? Why has the view of population growth reversed and become the new concern in the EU and the USA? AI and Digital Currencies are all the rage but how will they help peoples and nations prosper and flourish? These are just some of the questions we will delve into using rigorous research, examining scientific data and speaking to those who make policies at the national and international level.

Young people need to understand what is happening around them and learn how they can contribute to ensuring a better world for all, where peace and justice reign. Youth



need to take the lead but first, they must learn what political economic systems have worked historically and which have failed miserably.

Application Fee is a non-refundable donation of 50.00 euros if applying from the EU or \$50.00 if applying from the United States.

The Global Peacemaker Summer Program is designed for exceptionally bright undergraduates. The working language will be in English.

A typical day at UN in New York includes:

- § Breakfast on the run walk to the UN
- § Morning meeting & UN schedule.
- § Attend official UN committee meetings, speak with Ambassadors & delegates
- § Lunch at the UN with other youth delegates
- § Outside UN visits to UBER HQ, SNAPCHAT HQ, NYSE, Harvard U & Columbia U.
- § Research, learning and round table with invited speakers
- § Dinners at residence, invitation to embassy, or out on the town.

Participants will have time for cultural activities on weekends and for trips to Boston & D.C.

Academic credits for the 2022-2027 Global Peacemakers Summer Program should be directed by each students' home university.
